It shares a detailed examination of how Americans have become so polarized over the past decade. Patriocracy is produced and directed by award-winning documentary filmmaker Brian Malone and is Executive Produced by well-known producer, Stephen Nemeth. The LWV DC sent Door County School Superintendents a letter to share with their administrators and teachers making them aware of materials that are available to help teachers assist their students in understanding the Presidential election process. KIDS VOTE USA

Can you help for a few hours with Kids Vote on Election Day?

Kids Vote USA is a non-partisan non-profit who's mission statement is "...to ensure our future democracy by preparing our children to be educated and engaged voters." This is accomplished in two ways:

- Educators are provided an award winning curriculum for K-12 grades for free.
- Students are encouraged to go to the actual polling place where there parent(s) vote and cast a vote on a non-official ballot.

Volunteers are needed to help each student register, give each a ballot and have the student place the completed ballot in the ballot box. It is really quite simple... but every polling location needs at least one volunteer, especially in the after-school and early evening hours.
